- Enrolment form available in DE, EN, ES, FR, IT




Students per nationality 2022/23

What kind of <u>curriculum</u> does the European School have?



The European School is a school system which offers a single type of general academic education.

The child's schooling at the ES leads to the award of the Baccalaureate diploma. (German Abitur also)

Differentiation in teaching is a fundamental principle in order to make learning conditions suitable for every child.

If needed, additional **support** is organised at some time during the child's schooling.

Language Sections



DE EN ES FR IT

From P1 : Second language: English/French/German.

Continue with this until S7.

Or

SWALS (students without a language section): one lesson per day in their mother tongue. (starting in Nursery)

Second language is then automatically the language of the section.

In case of children with more than one nationality the decision on which section to join may have to be determined by a comparative language test organised by the school.




