


Priorities When Grouping Parallel Classes

- **Priority 1:** Similar numbers in parallel classes
- **Priority 2**: Balanced numbers girls, boys and new students
- Priority 3: MTT L1 aspect (grouping the same MTT L1 children in 1 class may be useful)
- **Priority 4**: Pedagogical aspect (it can be useful/necessary to separate children in P1)
- Priority 5: Parents' wishes must be based on social and/or language aspects, not on teacher preference.

L2

- In Primary 1, pupils must choose an L2 working language.
- L2 must be either English, French or German. L2 working language choice is for the next 12 years.
- The L2 program is harmonised and is based on the Common European Framework for Languages.
- 5 x 30 minutes per week

- Emphasis is on oral and aural skills and introduces the first contact with written language through games, role play, songs and arts and crafts using familiar themes (toys, school, etc).
- Parents are invited to an information evening during the first half-term.

- 2 X 60 mins. Sport lessons for P1 weekly according to timetable
- The children should wear sports clothes (shorts, T- shirt and indoor sport shoes and track-suits for outdoor sports)
- Wearing jewellery is dangerous and forbidden (watches, rings, long earrings and necklaces)
- If your child needs to be excused from sport lessons for medical reasons, please send in a note





- Offered in L1 if possible
- Minimum size of group: 7 pupils (horizontal/vertical grouping is possible)
- Alternatively offered in L2 or HCL

10. E.S.F. Behaviour Policy

Our new E.S.F. behavior policy was developed with the following aims in mind:

- To ensure that children feel safe at school and can work in a peaceful and productive environment.
- To encourage children to make good choices and take responsibility for their actions.
- Our policy is based around 5 basic golden rules.
- Examples are given of how these rules should be applied in different situations within the school environment.
- Class representatives from P3-P5 were also involved in the devising of the "golden rules" to make sure that they are child friendly.

Responsibilities of Parents



- Mandatory regular school attendance for all primary pupils
 - Absences on personal grounds
 - General Rules of the European Schools, Art. 30, c:
 - Permission may not be granted for the week preceding or the week following school holiday periods or public holidays.
 - WRITTEN REQUEST at least 1 week in advance to the deputy head: 2 days + resonable time for travelling
- Absences due to illness
 - mail to class teacher, doctor's note from 3rd day onwards
- Parents' meetings in September
- November Talks
- Communication Policy
 - Direct (appointment)
 - Email (10 lines max.)
