School Psychologist

The school psychologist is responsible for the entire school. She offers counselling and support to all pupils from the kindergarten to the secondary school, their parents, teachers, educational staff as well as school administration and management.

Scope of duties

Counselling and support to pupils and their parents in:

- Problems of the general school life
- Emotional/social problems
- Adaptation problems
- Anxiety (school fear, examination anxiety, social anxiety)
- Depression
- Behavioral problems
- Stress and performance anxiety
- Concentration and motivation problems
- Eating disorders
- Bullying

Counselling and support to teachers and pre-school teachers and assistants through:

- Discussions and individual counselling
- Observation in the classroom
- Discussions with parents
- Devising of support plans

Work principles

- Confidentiality
- Voluntary nature

The school psychologist works in cooperation with: Internally:
